DRAMA

Mimesis is the Greek word for imitation and drama is mimesis of action

PLOT

• Plot is the events in a story arranged artfully

It's not the same as story

• Many plots begin the story in media res

CHARACTER

• The various players portray different participants in action i.e. character

A character is revealed by words and actions

SETTING

• The place where all action takes place

• There may be unity of place or action may take place at various places

TONE AND MOOD

• Tone is the manner in which the characters address one another and the audience

 Mood is the overall feeling that action and tone generate during the play

DICTION

- Write about the rhetorical tropes used in the extract (alliteration, symbolism etc.)
- Comment upon the musical quality and the pattern of use of specific sounds, e.g. repetition of plosive consonants here (so many /g/ sounds in the first few lines and /p/ in the last line).
